### **CARB Hall of Fame and Museum Change-out**

On April 2, 2022, the CARB Hall of Fame, in conjunction with the Kansas City Automotive Museum, performed a change-out at the Museum in Olathe. For the CARB Hall of Fame and Museum wing, out went the old stock car and motorcycle that have been on display for some time. And in went two eye-popping open-wheel cars.

The beautiful black #7 midget car went onto the display, owned by Ray and Sandy Boyles. Ray has been a long-time Midget racing owner. In fact, he was instrumental in bringing midget racing back to Kansas City. Ray began his racing career in 1946 when his uncle told him they would be modifying a 1925 Model-T Roadster. This led to Jalopy racing and then to Super Modifieds. Ray left racing to start his own business. His hiatus did not last long, and with urging from his wife Sandy, they acquired two modified midgets to run at Sweet Springs, Sedalia, and Warrensburg, MO. They ran cars in the Chili Bowl for 23 straight years. The Boyles family have been long-time supporters of the CARB Hall of Fame and Museum.

The other car on display is an old, non-cage sprint car from the 1940s that has also been displayed in the National Sprint Car Hall of Fame. The "Customotive Special" #63 was built in 1948 by Marvin Faw while operating a speed shop in Los Angeles. He raced the car on the west coast in the Northwestern Racing Association with a Miller engine. Formerly from the Sioux Falls, South Dakota area, Marv returned there in early 1950 to run the IMCA circuit. In 1955, Marvin and his cousin Hank Hanestad prepared four cars to compete in the February IMCA opener in Tampa, Florida. The #63 was driven by "Wee Willie" Thompson and had a Ranger engine. Later that same year the car was sold to Fred Nelson. With an Offenhauser, Fred ran IMCA, AAA, and USAC. He won a race at the Minnesota State Fair.

Kenny Trimbo eventually bought the car and ran vintage races into the 1980s. He put a Volvo engine in the car, and it soon became known as the "Swedish Offy". Further restoration work on the car has been done since. The #63 car is currently owned by Dennis Ball of Richmond, Missouri.

Be sure and come to the Kansas City Automotive Museum to see the CARB Hall of Fame exhibit, as well as all of the other attractions the Museum has to offer. The cars in the CARB Hall of Fame exhibit will be on display until approximately October 1.



### The 2022 CARB Hall of Fame Legends Picnic


